**FEED THE CHILDREN, COMMUNITY ACTION PARTNERSHIP  
TEAM TO HELP 400 DAYTON-AREA FAMILIES IN NEED**

Feed The Children will bring one semi tractor-trailer full of food and essentials to the Dayton area on Thursday, September 22. The distribution, which is part of Feed The Children's Americans Feeding Americans Caravan, will take place at the Welcome Stadium, 1601 S. Edwin C Moses Blvd. in Dayton. The distribution will occur from 10 a.m. until 2 p.m., on a first-come, first-serve basis to 400 households. Community Action Partnership of the Greater Dayton Area is a Feed the Children partner agency. Each family will receive a 25-pound box of food, a 10-pound box of personal care items and a box of Avon products. The boxes are designed to help a family for up to one week.

To qualify for the distribution, bring proof or documentation of one of the following:

- TANF/Public Assistance,
- CareSource/Medicaid Card/AmeriGroup,
- food stamps,
- WIC, Social or Supplemental Security Income,
- unemployment assistance,
- letter of lay-off or
- a voucher from Community Action Partnership.

The Americans Feeding Americans Caravan began in 2009 as Feed The Children's answer to help fight hunger in America caused by the economic downturn. During these economic conditions, Community Action Partnership of the Greater Dayton Area is helping customers achieve self-sufficiency.
