You may qualify to make your home more comfortable and energy efficient for FREE!

Did you know?

- ◆ The Home Weatherization Assistance Program is a free energy efficiency program designed to decrease energy costs for low-income families, especially the elderly, persons with disabilities and people with children.
- ◆ Improper insulation of your home could cause extreme energy loss and increase your bills.
- ◆ Weatherizing your home may help you save up to 30% on your energy consumption each year!
- ◆ Weatherizing reduces your annual energy costs by about \$218 per household!



Who May Qualify?

- ◆ Households whose income are at or below 300 percent of the federal poverty guideline;
- ◆ Households who receive Supplemental Security Income (SSI) ;
- ◆ Households that receive benefits from the Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) or are enrolled in the Percentage of Income Payment Plan (PIPP);
- ◆ Both homeowners and renters; renters too can receive weatherization services with their landlord's approval;
- ◆ Both single and multi-family units, including Section 8 residents;
- ◆ Households that use all types of energy sources, including natural gas, electricity, propane oil, etc.

Our Certified Weatherization Crews provide FREE services throughout the year!

A weatherization representative performs an energy audit on your home. This includes a visual inspection to determine what energy savings measures may be done on your home. This also includes a safety inspection on the heating unit, gas stove and water tank.

Services that may be provided include insulation of attics, sidewalls, floors and foundation perimeter, sealing of heating ducts, weather stripping; tune-up or repair of heating systems or furnace upgrades as necessary; and any other measures to reduce air leakage.

Consumer education is provided to help reduce your energy usage and your bills.
