Helping Children and Families Succeed

Early Learning Centers

Provide high quality early learning programs for income eligible families of 3 and 4 year old children. Nationally accredited centers prepare children, regardless of income, for success in school. Childcare options are available.

Family Services

Provides support and information to families who are experiencing difficulty meeting their essential needs. Services include:

- Emergency Assistance
- Information and Referral (I&R)
- Ohio Benefit Bank
- Kinship Navigation
- Youth Asset Development

Helping Reduce Energy Costs

Emergency Home Energy Assistance Program (E-HEAP)

Assists income eligible households with energy needs, by providing financial assistance through programs like Summer Cooling and Winter Crisis.

Weatherization

Relieves the energy burden on low income citizens and brings energy-saving features like insulation, air sealing, furnace safety, and consumer education to their homes.

Housing for Seniors and Families

Housing

Provides and operates beautiful, clean, safe, and affordable housing for families and seniors in Warren County.



Helping Older Adults Remain Active and Independent

The 741 Center

Offers adults, 55 and over, an array of quality programs, services, activities, trips and information to enrich their lives. The Center provides a relaxed, welcoming atmosphere to socialize, make friends, and enjoy a healthy lunch.

Elderly Services Program (ESP)

Assesses and provides support services to older adults, age 60 and over, to help them remain safe and independent in their own homes. WCCS provides the Intake, Assessment and Care Management services for Warren County Elderly Services Program.

Homecare

Assists adults, 60 and over, with homemaking, personal care, respite care, and independent living assistance. Activities may include bathing, grooming, shopping, light housekeeping, etc.

Meals on Wheels™ and Senior Nutrition

Delivers fresh, nutritionally balanced lunches to homebound adults, 60 and over. Trained and caring drivers, who also provide a safety check for WCCS clients, deliver meals Monday through Friday. Weekend meals are also available. Hot, prepared fresh daily lunches are served at several senior luncheon sites throughout the county.

Retired and Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP)

Connects seniors, 55 and over, to meaningful community service opportunities at WCCS and various nonprofit organizations in Warren County. Volunteers may choose when, where, and how to serve.

Senior Transportation

Provides assisted medical and non-medical transportation to seniors, 60 and over, within Warren County and into all bordering counties.

Supportive Services

Provides adults, 60 and over, individualized assistance with applications, insurance, and refers clients to benefits and services including prescription programs. Income eligible seniors can receive a 40-pound box of food each month from Shared Harvest Food Bank Program.
